

Read 4-H is Back!

And completely redesigned!

Program Year: December 2024-July 2025

Who: All 4-Her's

What: Read 4-H is a program where 4-H members read books, complete projects, and get rewarded! The Extension Office will announce a theme each year and 4-her's will read books and complete tasks to get a reward at the end of each program year. All books that participants read need to be related to the theme. To earn the reward participants must complete at least 6 out of 10 tasks from the Task List. The Task List is available at the Extension Office, along with other necessary paperwork.

Theme: Exploration

Rewards: Yearly rewards will include a trip, special event, or a

physical prize related to each year's theme!



Read 4-H is Back!

Read 4-H is back and better than ever! After a good first program year last year, we wanted to figure out a way to encourage even more kids to participate in the reading project. So Read 4-H underwent a complete redesign and now is more fun than ever!

How the redesign works is that a yearly theme will be established by the Extension Office. Participants can now decide what books they read, as long as they are related to the yearly theme. At the end of the year Read 4-H participants will receive a prize, attend a special event, or go on a fun trip! To be eligible to receive the yearly price, participants will need to complete 6 out of 10 tasks from the task sheet. Some of the tasks must be turned in monthly such as the book review forms. Please have the monthly review forms turned in by the last day of each month. You cannot wait until the end of the program and turn in the review forms for all books.

This year the theme will be exploration. So pick books about exploring and going on fun adventures. More information about this year's prize will be sent out this spring. So get to reading and if you have any questions, please contact the Extension Office.




Sumner County Junior Leaders are Back!

Junior Producer Days

The K-State Junior Producer Days Series is a set of workshops for Kansas youth focused on the four main livestock species. Two workshops are hosted every year for two different species. This year a Swine and a Goat Producer Day will be held in Manhattan. Swine Producer Day is on Saturday March 1st and Goat Producer Day is on March 22nd. Flyers for both events are attached on this page and have also been emailed out. You can also find the flyers on "Kansas State Youth Livestock Program" Facebook page. If you currently participate or would like to participate in either species, I would highly encourage you to attend. Each Producer Day has both large informational sessions and small hands on sessions.

No matter if you are a beginner or have done livestock for several years, this is a great state level learning opportunity for 4-Her's. Also if you plan to show at either the State Fair or KJLS you are an in-person certification class will be offered at both events.

Prize: Winner will receive a \$20 gift card to Sonic.


<u>Leadership:</u> This would be a great addition to your 4-H Record Book, especially for the Visual Arts, Entomology, and Leadership projects.

"What do I have to do for 4-H Club Days"?

 4-H Club Days is an event held in the spring geared towards demonstrations and public speaking. 4-Her's are encouraged to prepare a talk, demonstration, or instrumental number to be given publicly. Club Days is currently held at the Raymond Frye Complex and lasts from roughly 9:00am to 1:00pm. This year it will be held on Saturday February 22nd. Contact the Extension Office for more details.

"Do I have to do Project Report Forms"?

• The short answer is no, no one is required to fill out Project Report Forms, but they are highly encouraged. These forms are simple fill in the blank forms that help set goals for a project and also record how the year went for a project. They are judged locally and seniors can go onto to regional and state level judging. These forms might seem silly now, but really help as 4-Her's start applying for post secondary education, scholarships, and internships.

"Why do I need to enroll as a volunteer"?

• Just like youth members, we ask that all volunteers enroll through 4-H Online. But why? The most important reason is that we conduct a background check on all volunteers. We do this to make sure our youth are safe, their safety is our top priority. In no way are we assuming negative things about our volunteers, but we want to have the utmost confidence in them and the positive interactions they will have with out youth. Also it helps the Office know how many volunteers we have and who might be able to help with certain projects or events. So if you are not currently enrolled as a volunteer through 4-HOnline please do so and if you have questions let the Office know.

4-H Scholarship Opportunities

There are a lot of fun learning opportunities all across the State and country, but often times cost is a limiting factor. 4-H cannot totally eliminate the factor of cost, but it can surely help. In Sumner County we have two different groups that offer scholarships to any 4-H related event. There is the Sumner County Development Fund whose sole purpose is to provide scholarships and resources to 4-Her's from our county and there is the Sumner County 4-H Council. The Council does a lot of things for the county beyond scholarship, but they have funds set aside to help as well.

For any 4-H related trip, camp, or activity you have the opportunity to write to each entity and request scholarship funds. These scholarship letters need to come from the 4-Her who plans to attend the event. Letters should include information about the event such as cost, location, and what the 4-Her might learn at the event. Also don't be afraid to include things about your involvement in the 4-H program here in Sumner County such as a project that relates to the event you are wanting scholarship to attend. There is also no limit on the amount of events you can received scholarship for, but we ask that you complete all letters several weeks before your event. This will allow our scholarship committee time to review your letters and award the scholarship. Lastly, hand writing the notes is not required but rather encouraged. It takes a lot of effort to write a letter and it shows a 4-Her's strong desire to go the the event that they are requesting scholarship for.

Once the Development Fund or Council receives your letter, they will meet and review it. Upon review each group will decide how much money they want to contribute to your event. Finally they will contact you and let you know their decision. So go out and look for fun learning opportunities and know that someone wants to help you go.

Side Notes

Looking back at my own time in 4-H, I wish I would have taken advantage of learning opportunities more. I did a lot locally but not across the whole state. Don't make the same mistake I did and limit yourself to only local learning opportunities. Take advantage of our awesome support system and find cool learning opportunities. As I mentioned in the main article, we have two awesome groups that have funds to help you out. The Development Fund in particular had the sole goal of helping 4-Her's and typically they do it monetarily! So be on the look out this springs for things you want to go to and write letters to both groups and take advantage of the scholarships they offer.
